

Check-in Check List

Please use this guide to help plan your dog's stay with us!

- Vaccination Record
 - Rabies Vaccine
 - Distemper/Parvo Vaccine
 - Negative Heartworm Test
 - Bordetella Vaccine
 - Canine Influenza Vaccine (H3N2 & H3N8)
- Bedding (dog bed, blanket, towel, etc)
- Toys – please do not bring any toys that could pose a health hazard while unsupervised
- Treats

Dog Food

- Dog Food – if you would like to provide your own.
 - Please provide us with clear instructions for feeding. Pre-packaging meals in zip-top bags is helpful, but not required.
 - Make sure you pack enough for the entire stay
 - **Consider sending a few extra meals, just in case.
 - We do have a refrigerator for cold items, if needed.
- Please leave food and water bowls at home, unless your dog needs a raised dish or special slow feed bowl.
- Please do NOT** attempt to treat your dog to “special food” while boarding. Suddenly introducing canned food or another new food can cause an upset stomach and/or diarrhea.

Medications

- Medications – clearly labeled with written instructions for dosage, how often, and how to administer
- We provide peanut butter, but you may bring an alternative if it will help your dog take his/her medicine!

You may call anytime we are open for an update on how your dog is doing! Please remember some dogs may need time to adjust before going back to normal behavior and eating habits. We will always give you an honest evaluation and if we are concerned at any time, we will contact you.

Your dog must be in good health in order to board with us at Brandywine Kennels. If your dog has exhibited coughing, sneezing, hacking, vomiting, or diarrhea, it is in his/her best interest to stay home. In the event of a contagious illness, please have them checked by your veterinarian and make arrangements for him/her to stay home.
